Pope Francis and the Faith of Ordinary Catholics

Recently, Pope Francis appointed 20 new cardinals. Popes do not pick their successors but they do pick a lot of those who will. If a conclave were held tomorrow, Pope Francis would have been responsible for about a quarter of the electors. He has gone a long way to ensure a continuity of approach.

But what exactly is the Holy Father's approach? It is increasingly evident from all he has said and done that he has a strong belief in the power of the Holy Spirit, and his main task is to set the Spirit free.

This reverses the usual process by which the Church discerns the will of God. Instead of the Holy Spirit being seen as active above all in the papacy, it seeks the Spirit at the periphery. It privileges the witness of the marginalised, such as the poor and oppressed, over the wisdom of academic specialists and career churchmen. What characterises the new crop of cardinals is that they are close to their people and hence close to where the Holy Spirit is most active. This illuminates Francis' method for tackling some of the thorny problems in the area of sexuality, marriage and family life. Instead of pouring over papal tomes in the Vatican library, Francis asks what ordinary people, their faith animated by the Spirit, believe is the best Christian response to these modern challenges.

Some of the answers may be liberal, but not necessarily. Francis is rebalancing the internal dynamics of the Catholic Church, restoring a balance that has been missing for some time. But Francis does not have a markedly progressive agenda – some of his appointments have been quite conservative. What is new is his way of "doing Catholicism" – harnessing the faith of ordinary Catholics, animated by the Holy Spirit, to guide the Church into all truth.
