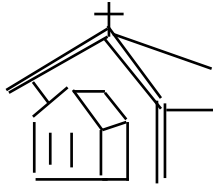

Today we celebrate The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). In this Eucharistic feast, the gifts of the bread and wine really and truly become the Body, Blood Soul and Divinity of Christ. Through this covenant of love, God draws us into his divine life and offers us food for our earthly pilgrimage to continue with faith and hope, confident in God's ability to transform our weaknesses and sufferings into life and joy.

One of the most commonly heard complaints these days from people and clergy alike is "the lack of reverence" that is frequently shown towards the Eucharist. Do we still genuflect or bow before the Blessed Sacrament? Do we keep reverent silence in the church out of respect for the presence of the Blessed Sacrament or for others who may be praying?
