St James the Apostle – July 25th

Saint James, the son of Zebedee and Salome, and the brother of John the 'beloved disciple', was one of the twelve apostles. He and his brother were mending their nets when they answered the call to follow Jesus. By ancient tradition he preached the gospel in the Iberian Peninsula (present day Spain and Portugal). He was executed by Herod Agrippa, probably the first of the apostles to be martyred.

A story goes that his remains were transported miraculously back to Compostels, in Galicia, in Spain and are now in the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela.

There are records of pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela from as far back as the 10th Century. It was one of the most important pilgrimage destinations during the Middle Ages, along with Rome and Jerusalem. Many

different routes, known as the Camino de Santiago de Compostela, remain enormously popular to this day. Over two hundred thousand people reached Santiago last year. The majority travel by foot.

As we celebrate the Feast of St James the Apostle next Saturday, let's remember all who are walking the Camino this year.
