Home is a sacred place

J. D. Salinger's third book *Franny and Zooey* (1961), was originally a series of two stories in *The New Yorker* in 1955 and 1957. There is a scene in the book in which Franny, a 20-year-old theology student, has just come home from college for a long weekend in November 1955. She's a nervous wreck. Her concerned mother, Bessie Glass, brings her a cup of chicken soup. Franny, unhappy, impatient, depressed, pushes the steaming cup of soup away. Franny's brother Zooey sees this rejection and is indignant. "I'll tell you one thing, Franny," he says. "If it's theology and religious life you're studying, you ought to know that you are missing out on every single religious action that's going on in this house. You don't have enough sense to drink a cup of consecrated chicken soup, which is the only kind of chicken soup that Mom ever brings to anybody!" What was Franny missing? The kitchen is the church. The mother is a priest. The soup is a sacrament; an external sign of God's healing grace. The pouring out of the

soup is a healing. "Mom's chicken soup" is "poured out" as a sacrament to soothe the soul, to quash the queasiness of a depressed daughter. That is why we read in today's Gospel that when the first cup of wine was poured out at the Cana wedding and offered to the steward of the banquet, the wedding feast was transformed.
