## May the Month of Mary

Since the 18<sup>th</sup> century devotion to Mary during the month of May grew popular in the church. From that time particular devotions have been practice; May processions honouring Mary, decorating with flowers, statues of Mary in the church or in our homes (May Altar), visits to the local grotto and churches dedicated to Mary, praying the rosary daily, saying of litanies of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the wearing of a Scapular and Medals, etc. May is seen as the beginning of new life and the beginning of summer in many parts of the world and as Mary is seen as the one who brought life into the world so it was logical that May be chosen as Mary's month and that May would call us to such Marian devotions.

Here in Glanmire our Grotto, "The Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes", was blessed following a procession from St Joseph's Church, Springhill on May Sunday 1949. This procession and ceremony has taken place every year since. Today, Sunday 1<sup>st</sup>

May the procession will leave St Joseph's Church at 3 pm.The homily will be given by Fr Charles Conroy MSC.

The Rosary will be recited at the grotto each evening for the month of May at 8 pm. Why not come and join us!

After all in May 2002 Pope John Paul 11 (now St John Paul 11) said, "Today we begin the month dedicated to Our Lady a favourite of popular devotion. In accord with a long-standing tradition of devotion, parishes and families continue to make the month of May a 'Marian' month celebrating it with many devout liturgical, catechetical and pastoral initiatives!"

The annual collection for the maintenance and development of the Grotto will take place at all masses today.

## May the month of First Holy Communion
