Reverence the Lord in your Hearts

In times past, children were required to show respect not just to their parents but to all their elders. Teachers and priests were always acknowledged with a salute. Other adults were greeted with "Good morning, Sir" or "Good evening, Ma'am" depending on the time of day. These courtesies were invariably observed among adults themselves. A similar gesture survives in rural Ireland as a mark of respect for the dead: men still uncover their heads when a hearse passes and many people will bless themselves. Now most of these formalities have gone.

"Reverence the Lord in your hearts," Peter tells us in today's reading. If God is not revered as sacred, nothing is sacred anymore. And in a timely warning to those in Ireland and elsewhere engaged in religious debate, he urges them to make their arguments "with courtesy and respect." These two qualities are notably absent in most religious disputes. Reverence for God, respect for persons and courtesy are all facets of the same virtue. Those who

are courteous may not always be believers, but the discourteous can never be true followers of Jesus Christ.
