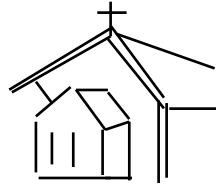

According to the Mishnah (*Shekalim* VI. 6), there were, standing up against the wall of the Court of Women in the Temple, 13 trumpet-shaped receptacles that held the gifts of the faithful for the Temple treasury. As Jesus and his disciples sat and watched the comings and goings of those offering their gifts of support, they observed many wealthy worshipers placing significant sums into the temple treasury. But it was not until Jesus observed the tiny offering of two *leptons* (equivalent to a couple of cent), made by a poor widow, that he was moved to comment on the proceedings.

It was not the woman's poverty that made her gift significant for Jesus. For him, it was the fact that this widow, alone among all the contributors lined up to give their offerings, gave her all. The very rich put in much, and the moderately well-off put in a decent amount. But all those who had gone before this widow had limited their giving by holding back a major portion

of their money for their own use. This widow stood alone as the one who had turned over, as an offering to God, everything she had -- two *leptons*.

Those two, almost worthless coins represented her last shred of security, her fragile earthly thread of hope for the future. With her deep desire to be an obedient servant of God, the widow gave all she had as an offering -- even her future -- for the sake of God. In other words, she gave herself totally into God's hands, with the sure conviction that God would give her the support she needed.
