Today is the Feast of the Ascension, the Day when the risen Jesus ascended into Heaven.

The Ascension happened when Jesus was speaking to the disciples for the last time that he had shown himself to them after the Resurrection. It happened soon after he had told that they would be baptised with the Holy Spirit in the very near future. It appears to have taken at least some of the disciples completely by surprise because they are staring intently at the sky for some time afterwards until two men dressed in white ask them why are they doing this and then they tell them that Jesus will return in the same way that they have seen him go. Are these the same two men dressed in white who appeared in the tomb on Easter Sunday and told the women to stop crying that Jesus had risen. Are they angles?

Jesus promises them that they will be clothed with power from on high very shortly. This is reference to the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. In a sense, Jesus' ascension into Heaven and his Resurrection is the beginning of the end of the 'old sinful' world.

We, Christians are living in a new era which is no longer measured by time as it was before, we are living in eternity.

Like the disciples on the Day of the Ascension, let us give thanks to God for the wondrous ascension of his son Jesus Christ and let us pray that we may rise up also to the Heavenly Realm.
