See in the sick the face of Christ

The blessing of throats on the Feast of St Blaise (Monday, 3rd February) is always a popular devotion especially during these days of colds and flus. It is a great tradition to ask for the intercession of the fourth century bishop and martyr, St Blaise. I pray and hope his intercession protects all from diseases of the throat and all other ailments. The blessing will take place after the 10am mass on the feastday.

In the meantime we continue to pray for all those who are sick especially those in our parish. On Tuesday week, 11 February, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes which Blessed Saint John Paul II declared as World Day of the Sick in 1993. When he did so he suggested that it be "a special time of prayer and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church and of reminding everyone to see in his sick brother or sister the face of Christ who, by suffering, dying and rising, achieved the salvation of humanity."

The tradition of praying for the sick finds its foundation in the teachings and ministry of Jesus Christ who cured the sick and prayed for the ill and infirm. It is a tradition continued throughout the history of the Church as described in the Letter of St. James: "Is anyone among you sick?

He should summon the priests of the church, and they should pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up. If they have committed any sins, they will be forgiven.

The Church continues to encourage the sick and infirm to receive the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick so that their faith and hope is strengthened and they will not give in to discouragement. The anointing of the sick will take place on the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes at the 10am Mass.

Ministers of the Word: 2020 Missals are now available in the sacristy.

At the 12 Noon Mass next Sunday some of the readings and prayers will be in Irish. Children from the First Holy Communion class in Gael Scoil Uí Drisceoil will attend.
