The transfiguration of Jesus on top of a mountain is the subject of today's gospel.

Through the transfiguration event, Jesus had allowed Peter, James and John a brief experience of Heaven. We also get a brief experience of heaven as we listen today's gospel and try to understand it or figure out why the transfiguration took place at this time.

While Jesus had told the apostles he was the son of God before this day and they had witnessed Jesus perform many varied miracles and heard him preach with authority, this experience must have completely convinced Peter, James and John that Jesus was the Son of God. They also saw and heard Moses and Elijah, Moses the prophet who had been given the ten commandments and Elijah the prophet who had been taken up to Heaven in spectacular manner while still alive.

The three had been given a taste of Heaven, a taste of what eternal life would be like, an insight into a different dimension of existence.

Have you ever experienced a taste of Heaven? Have you ever had a religious experience that defied easy explanation or any type of explanation at all? When did this happen? Where did it happen?

Were you on your own or with others?

It can happen anywhere. Anywhere and at any time when God breaks through all the barriers we erect between ourselves and himself. Like the apostles treasure your experience and let it nourish your life.
