A GOOD LITTLE STORY

A frail old man went to live with his son, daughter-in-law, and a four-year old grandson. They ate together nightly. But the elderly granddad's shaky hands and failing sight made eating difficult. Peas rolled off his spoon onto the floor. When he grasped the glass often milk spilled on the tablecloth. The son and daughter-in-law became irritated. "We must do something about granddad," said the son.

So they set a small table in the corner. There, granddad ate alone. Since he had broken a dish or two, his food was served in a wooden bowl. Sometimes when the family glanced in granddad's direction, he had a tear in his eye as he ate alone. The four-year-old watched it all in silence.

One evening the father noticed his son playing with wood scraps on the floor. He asked, "What are you making?" The boy responded, "Oh, I am making a

little bowl for you and mum to eat your food from when I grow up." The words so struck the parents that they were speechless. Then tears started to stream down their cheeks.

Though no word was spoken, both knew what must be done. That evening the husband took granddad's hand and gently led him back to the family table. For the remainder of his days he ate every meal with the family. And neither husband nor wife seemed to care any longer when a fork was dropped, milk spilled, or the tablecloth soiled. Children are remarkably perceptive.
