Reflection – 25th Sunday Ordinary Time – (23-24 September 2023) The Vineyard is the Kingdom of Heaven

When I hear this parable about the labourers in the vineyard, I generally think that the landowner is unfair to the labourers who worked all day paying them the same wage as those who were employed at different times during the day and particularly those who only did an hour's work late in the day. However, then I reread the parable and I pay attention to the first two sentences. 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard.' I realise that this parable is not about the way the economy of a vineyard is run here on earth. This parable is about the Kingdom of Heaven. The vineyard owner is God. The labourers are all the people who get an opportunity to hear the word of God and live by it. The agreed daily wage is God's agreement with any of his believers that once they listen to the word of God and put it into action in their daily life then they will get their reward life in the Kingdom of Heaven. The work day in this parable represents

a person's life on earth. Jesus used this parable to explain that whether you hear the word of God and put it action as a young child or whether you only hear about the word of God and put it into action later in life the reward, the wage/reward is exactly the same, eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven.
