Holy Trinity Sunday

The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is difficult to explain and understand. Even the brilliant philosopher St Augustine had problems explaining it.

There is a very old and much-repeated story about St Augustine, one of the intellectual giants of the Church. He was walking by the seashore one day, attempting to conceive of an intelligent explanation for the Mystery of the Holy Trinity. As he walked along the beach, he saw a small boy pouring seawater from a shell into a small hole in the sand. 'What are you doing my child?' asked St Augustine. 'I am emptying the sea into this hole' the boy answered with an innocent smile. 'But that is impossible, my dear child,' said St Augustine. The boy stood up, looked straight into the eyes of St. Augustine and replied, 'What you are trying to do - comprehend the immensity of God with your small head – is even more impossible.'
